




## The DIVAS Dish—Animal Advice from the Wise Asses

The dreaded November celebration approaches, and our flock fears the worst.


The little birds tell us you are wise and all-knowing.

No, we have evolved beyond such primitive concerns,. We now feel a sense of duty toward less fortunate creatures.


