Recently this handsome red fox took an early spring nap under a tree right below Dunrovin's Bench Webcam. Dunrovin is blessed with frequent red foxes because it provides good habitat for them to thrive: a mixture of forest and open country near water and agricultural areas that support the small mammals which are their prey. Foxes are most often within view of the Bench Webcam as it is located along the edge of the forest, where foxes prefer to hunt. They have, however, been seen by every Dunrovin webcam. Red foxes occur across all of Montana and much of the eastern and northern sections of the US, and the whole of both Canada and Alaska. These sly hunters are a joy to watch as they go about their daily lives in front of Dunrovin's many webcams.

Many Fox Views During all Seasons

Foxes provide our D@D members with hours of entertainment as they hunt near the bird feeders, follow the grazing horses that stir up mice, leap in the snow of winter and high grass of summer to catch a meal, check out the river banks, dig for ground squirrels, and line up under the ospreys' nest in the hopes of snagging a falling fish. Effective nighttime hunters, the foxes often show up at the Bench Webcam illuminated by the inferred lights that are invisible to them.
